#### Hannah Dallow - (Jack)

#### Karina Farnlucher - (Tom)

Karina first appeared as a *Rabbit* in "Snow White". She has been in many of our pantomimes, and plays the piano and guitar in her spare time.

Maggie has been a regular chorus member in HTC pantomimes over recent years. This is her first 'speaking' part.

#### Jenna Gedsyk (Pig)
