Hannah Dallow - (Corporal Fudge)

Having first appeared for HTC in 'Humpty Dumpty,' Hannah took the leading role of *Talida* in last year's pantomime 'Sinbad' and then played *Sandra* in 'Breezeblock Park'.

Emma Dixon - (Weil)

Emma was in the chorus of 'Sinbad' last year. This is her first role as a Principal.

Karina Farnlucher - (Prince Nikki)

Since starting with HTC as a junior, Karina has been in many of our pantomimes, and last played *Tom* in 'Humpty Dumpty.'

Pru Harrold (Stage Manager)

Gemma played *Coco* in 'Sinbad,' *Jean* in 'Breezeblock Park,' and also appeared as a *Waitress* in 'Confusions.' She also plays the clarinet and sings in school & church choirs.
