Cast Notes

Dorian Burrows (Nasturtium) is making his second appearance with HTC having played Rasah-al-Gammon in 'Ali Baba' last year.

Lee Carter (*Baldock*) is making his first appearance as a principal character for HTC.

Mo Cooke (*Fairy Godmother*) is making a rare appearance in pantomime—she says she couldn't resist playing a fairy!

Heidi Farnlucher (Cinderella) was principal boy in 'Puss in Boots' back in 1989, and has been involved in a number of our productions since then.

Karina Farnlucher (*Prince*) has been a regular member in HTC pantomimes over the years.

Pru Harrold (*Griselda*) has played many and varied parts in pantomimes, comedies and more serious plays. She played *Fatima* in 'Ali Baba' and was seen as *Sarah Rocliffe* in 'The Broomsquire'.

Ashleigh Keech (*Puck*) is making her first appearance in a principal role, having been a member of the HTC junior chorus for many years.

Jo Levy (Musical Director + Piano) Good humour and patience are prime requirements of a pantomime musical director, and we are very lucky that Jo has both. She also plays a mean piano!

Laurie Lewis (Gloria) joined HTC in 1988, and has played various roles including Jiminy Cricket in 'Pinocchio,' the title role in 'Humpty Dumpty,' and Barbara Baba in 'Ali Baba'.

John McGregor (Petunia) joined HTC in 1991, and among other parts has played Squire Aldworthy in 'Tom Jones', King George in 'Jack and the Beanstalk,' the Duke of York in 'Humpty Dumpty' and Cassim Baba in 'Ali Baba'.

Becky Radford (*Alice*) continues a long-established family tradition of involvement in HTC pantos. She played *Morgiana* in 'Ali Baba' last year.

Daniel Radford (*Buttons*) follows in an established thespian line, and is taking his first principal role this year.

Jo Smith (Author/Director) joined HTC in 1978, his first role being Cassim in Stan & Joan Sharp's 'Ali Baba' Since then he has played many roles in the Club, particularly enjoying pantomimes. He now writes and publishes for a living, and is responsible for today's script. Oh yes he is!

Jamie Stickler (*Squire*) made an unnerving *Rhum Baba* last year, but thankfully plays a straight Squire today.

Nick Webb (Baron Hardup) joined HTC as a junior more years ago than he cares to remember and has appeared in most Club shows since then. He played Markham in 'The Broomsquire,' and was the eponymous Ali Baba in last year's pantomime.

Rachel Whittaker (*Dandini*) was a *Serving Wench* in The Broomsquire, and is making her first appearance as a principal panto character this year.

Deb Williamson (*Stage Manager*) currently watches TV for a living—dream on! One day she will be a famous cameraman, but right now has to make do with sorting out HTC!

Dil Williamson (*Co-director* + *chorus*) is the current chairman of Headley Theatre Club, for whom she also acts, sings, dances, directs, back-stages, front-of-houses, and stops bucks from passing.
