## **Cast Notes**

Ruth Beesley (Princess Rose) Do I get to have a say in all this?

I asked for Rose to be a stroppy teenager – Ruth auditioned for the part and made it hers!

**David Burnham** (*King Harold*) She might become like her mother.

He said he wouldn't be seen dead on a stage – then he got inveigled into the Music Hall, and now look... Mind you, he could also be band.

**Justine Carter** (*Marigold*) Are you the Prince?

I asked for Marigold to be a parent's worst nightmare – the friend who eggs their daughter on to unreasonable behaviour. You judge!

Vicky Chappell (Sir Rowan) No, that's the Prince over there.

I could have cast Sir Rowan as a wimpish, forelock-tugging mouse of man – but that's not how they make them in Wigan!

Wendy Downs (Belladonna) You will regret this, mortals!

It's always interesting to cast one of the nicest people you know as a died-inthe-wool villain – and then sling a Scissor Sisters song at her!

**Pru Harrold** (Benjamin) It would not be prudent.

Well, it wasn't going to be Pru – but she stepped in at the last moment and learnt the part with unnerving haste. Thanks!

Teresa Marsh (Queen Matilda) First sign of madness.

I've known Teresa for more years than either of us probably want to acknowledge, but this is the first time I've had the pleasure of directing her. I hope not the last.

John McGregor (Constance) Quite so, your majesty.

Not only does John do the cross-dressing, but he also calls his wife an idiot on stage and gets away with it (I think!).

**Christopher Potts** (*Gerald the Herald*) No more interruptions?

I told Christopher to make this role as big as he liked – there is no such thing as OTT in panto!

Mel White (Prince Rufus) We've done our duty.

Back from exile in Yorkshire, Mel carries on with panto duty – not sure the thigh-slapping would have suited Flora Thompson though.

**Dil Williamson-Smith** (*Lilac*) There will now be an interval of 100 years! I am cursed that I wrote in verse – see the Lilac Fairy fight it – All the same, she's half to blame, 'cause of course she helped me write it!
