Cast Notes

Annaliese Farnlucher (*Princess Rose*) Do I get to have a say in all this? I asked for Rose to be a stroppy teenager – Annaliese auditioned for the part and made it hers!

Karina Farnlucher (Queen Matilda) First sign of madness.

Mother to the Princess – you know it makes sense!

Neil Hardinge (Gerald the Herald) No more interruptions?

I told Neil to make this role as big as he liked – there is no such thing as OTT in panto!

Abby Hibberd (Marigold) Are you the Prince?

I asked for Marigold to be a parent's worst nightmare – the friend who eggs their daughter on to unreasonable behaviour. You judge!

Rufus Kendall (Constance) Quite so, your majesty.

There's always a battle within the Club to become the Dame – so many cross dressers! This year it's Rufus's turn. And what a turn!

Jonathan Neil (Belladonna) You will regret this, mortals!

It's always interesting to cast one of the nicest people you know as a died-inthe-wool villain – and then sling a Scissor Sisters song at him!

Nick Webb (Benjamin) It would not be prudent.

Well, it was Pru last time we ran this script – but Mr Webb nicked it this time.

Martin Wellen (King Harold) She might become like her mother.

A man of many talents, from doing the Dame to looking after the lighting. This time he has to look after the Queen!

Mel White (Sir Rowan) No, that's the Prince over there.

I could have cast Sir Rowan as a wimpish, forelock-tugging mouse of man – but that's not how they make them in Huddersfield!

Kathryn Witts (*Prince Rufus*) We've done our duty.

Quickly got the hang of the thigh-slapping. Duty well done!

Dil Williamson-Smith (*Lilac*) There will now be an interval of 100 years! *I am cursed that I wrote in verse – see the Lilac Fairy fight it –*

All the same, she's half to blame, 'cause of course she helped me write it!
